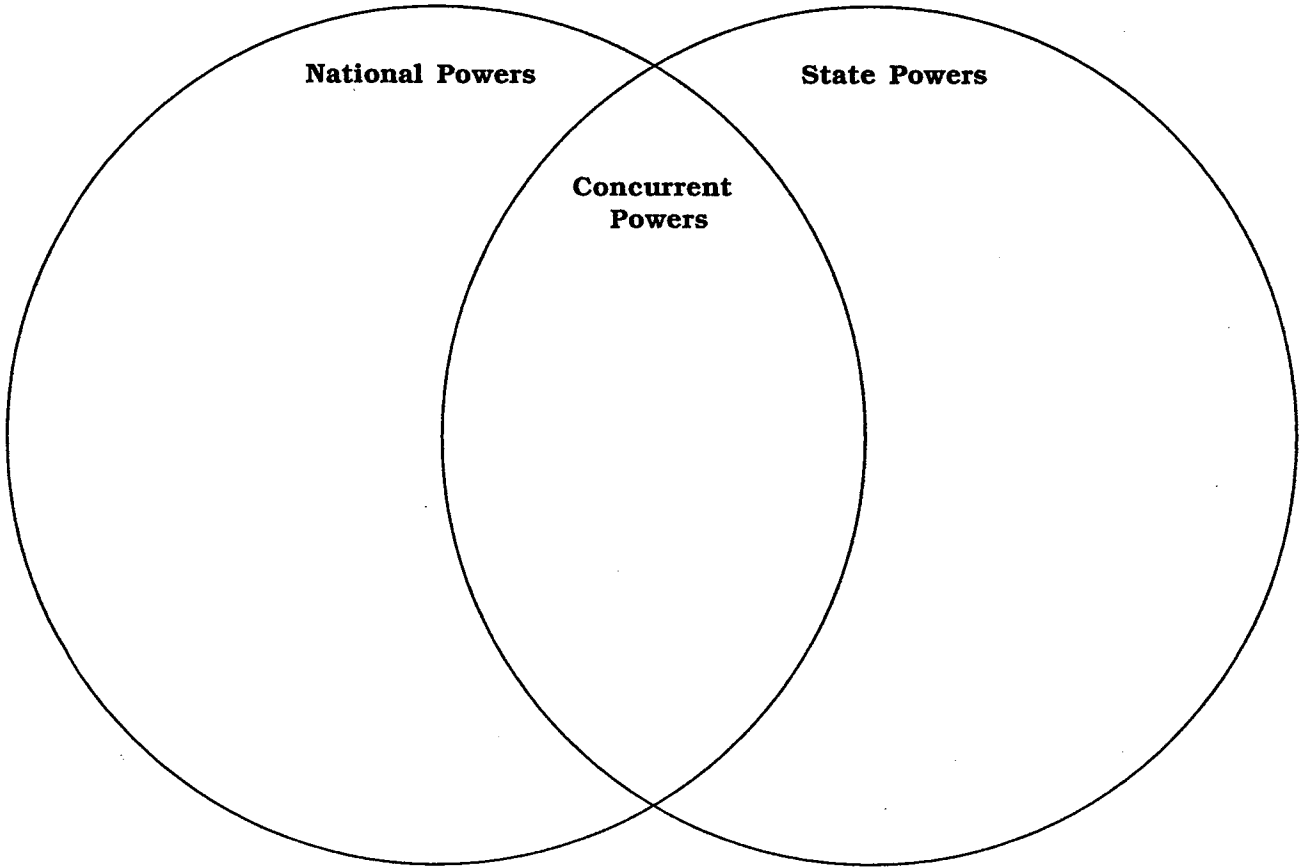


The Separation of Powers

Use the Constitution as a reference to place the following powers in the appropriate section of the Venn diagram.

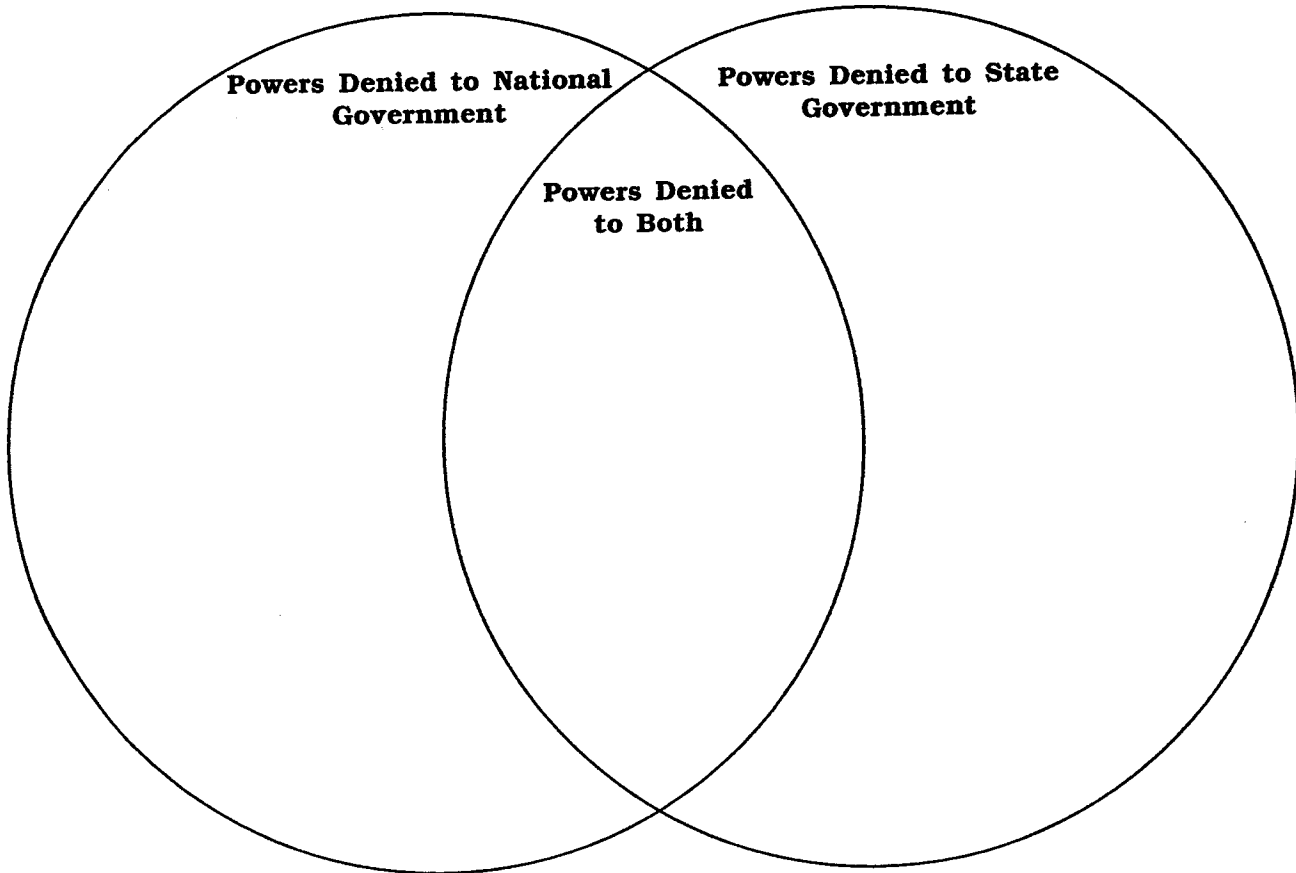


Powers
