The Up-Island Regional School Committee (UIRSC) meeting was called to order.

Public Hearing and Discussion of Fiscal Year 2024 (FY24) Budget for the Up Island RegionalSchool District(See documents on file & 12/19/22 Minutes #VI D.)(Agenda item #I)• The Public Hearing was opened at 5:04PM*During the discussion Boxanne Ackerman entered the

• The Public Hearing was opened at 5:04PM. *During the discussion Roxanne Ackerman entered the meeting at 5:11PM.

• Version #5, already distributed to UIRSC and Town Finance Committees (FinComs), was reviewed.

• <u>The total operating budget was \$14,921,475</u> (Medicaid and School Choice offsets not included) <u>with a \$1,018,000 or 7.33% increase</u>, driven by collective bargaining agreements enrollment growth, and spiking inflation; and showing a slight net decrease in total Full Time Equivalents (FTEs).

- The Superintendent's Shared Services (or Central) Office was up 4.2% (\sim \$74,000+) as assessed by student population from the Office total increase of 5.97%.

- The West Tisbury School (WTS) site was up \$495,472 or 6.24% increase over FY23 with a 1.0 FTE net decrease. Version #5 included a \$2,000 furniture increase as voted.

- The Chilmark School site was up \$195,882 or 11.13% over FY23, largely due to population growth. Version #5 included \$5,000 furniture increase and 0.2 FTE expansion of the Reading Teacher.

- The District site increased \$253,000 or 9.51% largely due to a \$213,000 increase in the Contingency Reserve—see below E & D.

- The possible Chilmark School Heating/Ventilation/Air Conditioning (HVAC) overage estimate was removed from the Capital site as it would impact the FY25 budget.

- <u>The total assessed budget increase was 5.26% over FY23</u>. Revenues were estimated as follows.
- Chapter 70 usually increased very slightly and was set at FY23 receipts.
- Chapter 71 was increased to \$239,000 in keeping with the latest projections.
- Charter School was set at FY23 actuals.
- Medicaid was projected on the best information available as were School Choice receipts.
- The Excess and Deficiency (E & D) offset was \$440,000, covering:
 - ^o the standard ~ \$99,000 Contingency Reserve;

^o ~ \$116,500 offset to reduce the previous year's offset (see 12/17/21 Minutes p.2);

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^o \$213,000 to cover 3 Education Support Professional (ESP) positions in case of unknown student population needs. Hopefully the positions would not be required and funds would revert to E & D.

- The three Towns' assessment proportions changed due to enrollment shifts between schools— Chilmark School growth from 57 to 70, and WTS decrease to 337 due to a large graduating 8th grade. (Foundation enrollment reported on the census but not here included 12 home schooled students as well as those few in private schools.)

• Skipper Manter repeated previous objections to E & D as over-assessing taxpayers and to the Contingency line as more properly to be distributed among the school sites.

• The UIRSC had examined several versions and felt they were presenting an excellent budget, noting that all MVPS were experiencing large FY24 increases after the collective bargaining agreements.

• The Public Hearing was closed at 5:27PM.
